Jack Sullivan - Former President Honolulu Quarterback Club – Jack said he credits Al Minn with being the first AD interested in starting the Hawaii Collegiate League in the mid 80's. After a QB meeting at the Chuckwagon, Jack approached Al, QB President, who was the AD at Hawaii Loa and asked what it was going to take to start the league that so many organizations were asking for. He replied, "you find me other interest AD's first." It just so happened that in the parking lot at that moment were the answers to our prayers. Present were three other AD's Mike Vasconcellos (Chaminade), Ted Chidester (BYUH), and Dan McFadden (HPC, now HPU). And so it began, with four Community Colleges Kapiolani, Windward, Leeward, and Honolulu, plus UH, Hawaii Loa, BYUH, HPC and Chaminade. Imagine nine colleges playing. The are many more stories about Al Minn that will be presented during the luncheon on Monday at the HQC luncheon.
