**+ Mike Brown – Head Diving Coach & Anita Rossing Asst. Diving Coach - University of Hawai’i**

**Carmyn James - Head Coach - Women's Track & Field Program & Cross Country– University of Hawai’i** - Coach Carmyn in her 12th season as Head Coach of the Women’s Track & Field Program will report on her 2nd trip with the team to Seattle for the University of Washington Invitational held over the weekend. Two weeks ago, the Rainbow Wahine began their season at the UW Indoor Preview. Junior Ashlee Jimenez scored a new school record in the 600-meters while TeRina Keenan placed 2nd. in the shot put and Madara Apine was 3rd. in the triple jump. In a 3rd trip to Seattle, UH will send a contingent of 20 athletes, who will compete in 15 events, including Kaleigh Morrison, who will participate in the 5-discipline pentathlon. Coach Carmyn will also introduce her newest addition to her coaching staff, **Sailala (Sue) Zumbado**. Coach Sailala, a (throws) Coach is a 7 time NCAA Champion (4 time in Discus & 3 time in Shot Put). No other NCAA female athlete has ever won that many titles and she is just the 2nd one in history to win 4 consecutive titles - all in discus. She is also a 2 time Olympian for the USA (2000 & 2004) and she has been a finalist at 2 World Championships. Coach will entertain questions for the audience.

**Mike Brown - Head Diving Coach & Anita Rossing Asst. Diving Coach - University of Hawai’i** - Coach Mike is in his 12th year coaching diving at the University of Hawai’i and along with his wife, Coach Anita Rossing, who is also in her 12th season, and the “UH Divers” have earned two individual NCAA diving titles in 2005 and 2008. The 2005-6 women’s team was the top point scoring diving team at the 2006 NCAA Championships. The UH men’s and women’s swimming and diving teams beat Wisconsin in a dual match in mid-January. Senior diver Daniella Nero scored personal best on the springboard. She won the 1 and 3-meter women’s events while Genevieve Bradley placed 3rd. Douglas Cohen won the 1-meter dive along with Luke Hayes who scored a personal best in winning the 3-meter event. Both UH teams head to their respective championships, the men compete in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Diving Championships in Long Beach while the women compete in the Western Athletic Conference Diving Championships in San Antonio. Both Coaches Mike and Anita will be available for questions at the luncheon.
