Tony Selitto - Head Coach - Men's Basketball - Hawaii Pacific University -

"Tony the Tiger" ends his second run as head coach of the "Sea Riders" at HPU at the end of this season. Currently the team's overall record is 13-4 and HPU is ranked second in the Pacific West Conference with a 5-1 record. Last week, HPU lost by 1 point to defending conference champions, BYU-Hawaii. Coach Tony has compiled a record of 317-206 over his HPU employment, 1988-2002 and 2008 to present as the head coach. He believes that currently this is his best team he has coached since the HPU won the national championship game against Kansas City. Come to the luncheon and hear about the players, the team and Tony's inside stories that you never hear, see or read about in the media.

Casey Nakama - Director of Instruction - Casey Nakama Golf Development Center - Olomana Golf Links -

Casey has been a golf professional since 1985. He traveled on the Asian Tour during the late 80's and early 90's. Casey was a Ben Hogan/PGA Tour member and a winner of many local tournaments including the Hilo Invitational, Hawai'i

State Open, JAL Rainbow Open, Makaha Open, Maui Open, Mid-Pacific Open, and Waikoloa Open plus several others. He has been a golf instructor since 1992 and has mentored many juniors over the years. In 2003, Casey received an honorary distinction by Golf Digest Magazine for one of the top golf instructors for the State of Hawai'i. He has also won honors in basketball and track & field during his high school days. Casey has mentored many of Hawai'i's biggest and brightest golf stars like Michelle Wie, Dean Wilson, Norman-Ganin Asao, Joe Phengsavath, Bradley Shigezawa who was the youngest player to qualify for the Manoa Cup and broke Michelle Wie's record at 11 years, 8 months and World Champion at the age of 13 at the 2005 Optimist Jr. Tournament and Cyd Okino, at 11 years old, won the 2005 Hawai'i State Women's Golf Association Match-Play Tournament and qualified for the 2005 USGA Women's Amateur Public Links Championship. Casey will give us an update on these champions and who he is currently teaching at the center. He will be open for questions at the luncheon.
