The Honolulu Quarterback Club, celebrating 64 Years, is pleased to announce the following Guest Speakers for their luncheon, Monday, April 5th, at the Maple Garden Restaurant. The Maple Garden is located at 909 Isenberg (near the corner of King and Isenberg directly across from the Old Stadium Park) and there is free parking next to the Restaurant or street parking is available. The entrance to the meeting room is located at the rear of the Maple Garden building through the parking lot. Lunch is at 11:30 am and the program begins at 12 noon:

Mike Brown - Head Diving Coach - Men's & Women's Swimming & Diving - University of Hawaii - Coach Mike is in his 10th year coaching diving at the University of Hawai'i. Along with his wife Anita Rossing, Coach Mike, and the UH Divers have earned two individual NCAA diving titles in 2005 and 2008 along with 1 national women's team high point distinction at the 2006 NCAA Championships. At the end of February this year, the "Rainbow Swimmers", finished 6th at the WAC Championships and Coach Mike was selected Diving Coach of the Year for the 5th. year in a row and 6th. time in his career. Stephanie De Lima was named the WAC Diver of the year which gave the "Rainbow Wahine" Divers, the diver of the year title, 8 out of the last 9 seasons. In the NCAA Zone E diving championships, Stephanie De Lima just missed qualifying for the NCAA Championships by finishing in 11th place and Douglas Cohen finished in 17th place who also didn't qualify. Coach Mike will review the season, the team members both female and male divers on Monday at the Quarterback Luncheon. He will be available for questions.

Scott Wong - Associate Coach - "Rainbow Wahine" Volleyball - University of Hawaii - Coach Scott recently was named Associate Coach of the "Rainbow Wahine" volleyball staff at the University. He was the associate head coach for the University of San Francisco and served as an assistant coach on the men's team. Coach Scott isn't new to the "Wahine", he spent a season in 2006 as a volunteer assistant. As Head Coach Dave Shoji said, "he brings a fresh outlook to our program after extensive work on the men's side of volleyball. He's a seasoned recruiter and brings tactical expertise from many different views of the game". Coach Scott graduated from Punahou where he was an outstanding player and named an all-state honoree in both volleyball and basketball. He went on to play for Pepperdine and earned AVCA All-America honors 3 times and MPSF all-conference honors during all 4 years. In 1998, Coach Scott was named the AVCA National and MPSF Freshman of the Year. He went on to play with the U.S. National Team and helped the team win a gold medal in the 2001 University Games. After that, Coach Scott played professional beach volleyball, finishing 2nd place in the 2007 New York AVP Tour and was ranked as high as 16th individually and his team ranked as high as 6th in the AVP rankings. Coach Scott will talk about the spring match where the "Rainbow Wahine" beat Arizona with some new "Wahine" players and the selection of Kanani Danielson to the U.S. Women's National A2 Team for 2010. He will be available for questions from attendees at the HQC luncheon on Monday.
