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The Honolulu Quarterback Club, celebrating 67 years, is pleased to announce the following Guest Speakers for their luncheon, Monday, April 8th., at the MGR:

+ Todd Iacovelli -Runner & Boy's JV and Varsity Running Coach - Punahou

+ John Clark - "Dr. Beach" - Author of 8 Books on Hawai'i's Beaches

Todd Iacovelli - Runner & Boy's JV and Varsity Running Coach - Punahou - You may remember Coach Todd from his running days at Punahou. He is an 8-time Hawai'i State High School Champion winning 5 individual titles, 1 in cross country and 4 in track and field. During his senior year, he set the state record in the 3,000 and 1500 meters. He is a 2-time winner of the Gatorade High School Track and Field Athlete of the year and was inducted into the Hawai'i High School Hall of Honor. During his collegiate years, he ran for the University of Michigan and was a 4-time Academic All-Big 10, a 1-time winner of the Big Ten athlete of the week, and a winner in the 5,000 meter Michigan Intercollegiate Championships. Since he only used 3 of his 4 years of college eligibility at Michigan, he came back to Hawai'i and ran for HPU while studying for a Master's Degree in Business Administration. While at HPU, he became a Cross-Country All American in 2007 & was named HPU Student-Athlete of the Year. In 2008 he won the Great Aloha Run and his best time in a half-marathon is 1:10:07. Coach Todd was 4th over-all in the 2012 Hapalua Half Marathon and he ended up 6th over-all in the recently completed 2013 Hapalua Half Marathon. Beside being a Financial Advisor Associate at Morgan Stanley Wealth Management, he is the Coach for the Boy's JV and Varsity Cross Country and Track Team. In addition, Coach Todd is a Running Coach for the BOCA Marathon & participates in Triathlon Clinic. .

John Clark - "Dr. Beach" - Author of 8 Books on Hawai'i's Beaches - John, a retired Deputy Fire Chief of the Honolulu Fire Department, has authored books covering Hawai'i beaches since 1972. He has written books on beaches for each island and his most current book, "Hawaiian Surfing: Traditions for the Past" was published last year. John has been a planning consultant and was a subcontractor on water safety projects and on Environmental Impact Statements, specifically social impact assessments to identify impacts to beach/ocean and user groups. He has been involved in quite a few water projects including the most recent, "Wave Energy Technology Buoy Project, Ocean Recreation and Public Safety Report, Marine Corps Base, Hawai'i, Kaneohe Bay, Helber Hastert & Fee Planners, Inc. John was also involved in the Waikiki Beach Sand Restoration Project. He holds a Masters degree in Public Administration which he earned from the University of Hawai'i. John has been Race Director for the Hawai'i Dragon Boat Races, and is a former President of the Hawaiian Historical Society, a Contest Director for the World Police and Fire Games Surfing Event in Honolulu and is currently a High School Surf Coach for a Certification Program. John will be available for questions.
