- + **Summer Harrison – Sophomore – Qualified for Olympic Swim Trials – Mid-Pacific Institute**

Sol Batoon – Athletic Director – St. Francis School - Coach Sol has been named the 2011-2012 Coach of Year for ILH Division II. Under his coaching, the team entered the state finals after only having a boys' varsity basketball program for 2 years at the school. The team's record for the season was 11-1 and overall 18-7. Amazingly, the team doesn't have any Seniors on the team. Coach Sol will talk about the team, the players and the season. He will take questions from luncheon attendees.

Summer Harrison – Sophomore – Swimmer – Mid-Pac Institute – Summer who is only a 16 years old and a sophomore at Mid-Pac qualified for the Olympic Swim Trials with a time of 1 minute and 1.25 seconds in the 100-meter butterfly at the Senior Sectionals on the mainland. To qualify, she had to swim 1 minute 99 seconds or under. She will compete in the U.S. Olympic Trails, which start in late June on the mainland. She credits her coaches and team members in helping her meet the qualification. As a child, she started swimming at the age of 2 and started competing at 8. Sean and Shannon, Summer's parents, were swimmers at Long Beach State. Swimming has always been part of Summer's life as the family spent a lot of time at the pool. Summer's main swimming events are the 100-meter butterfly, the 100-meter freestyle and the 50-meter freestyle. Summer is an A student and plays the piano, and surfs. She is the record holder of the short-course 100-meter butterfly, a record previously held for 32 years and the long course 100-meter butterfly. Summer is a candidate for the 2012 March Female Sports Person the Month selected by the Honolulu Quarterback Club. She will entertain questions.
