This tournament is regarded as one of the nation's premier showcase events for girls basketball and annually attracts dozens of college coaches. Team Aloha, appropriately named and called in 2006, won the prestigious championship at the tournament. This year, Team Aloha, comprised of 10 all-stars along with new Head Coach Fran Villarmia-Kahawai, went 2 - 2 in the tournament and 3 - 2 overall, matching their previous performance last year. Mayor Hannemann will introduce Coach Fran to HQC Members and attendees on Monday at the luncheon.

Fran Villarmia-Kahawai - Head Coach - Team Aloha - Coach Fran, the new Head Coach of Team Aloha, is a former Aiea High School and University of Hawaii "star" player. She started her coaching career in 1994 at her High School, Aiea and coached JV boys basketball until 1998 and then in 1999 she became Head Coach of the Varsity Girls Team. In 2001, she coached her team to win the state championship but step down from coaching to spend more time with her growing family. She was a walk-on at UH and and received a scholarship after her first semester. She will talk about this year's team players and the tournament. The team this year consisted of 4 returnees from last year: Kalei Adolpho from Moloka'i, Brydgette Tatupu-Leopoldo from Farrington, Lia Galdeira from Konawaena, Mysha Sataraka from Punahou, and the rest of the team, Dawnyelle Awa and Anuhea Wall

both from Konawaena, **Kirsten Liana** from Farrington, **Hailey Maeda** from Punahou, **Deyah Fa'asoa** from Kaimuki and from Iolani, **Alex Masa-quel**.
