### + Dr. Tom Apple – Chancellor – University of Hawai'i at Manoa

**Dr. Tom Apple – Chancellor – University of Hawai'i at Manoa** – In May, Dr. Tom Apple, distinguished scientist and academic leader, was selected as the new chancellor of the University of Hawai'i at Manoa. Previously, he served as a dean and as provost at the University of Delaware. He was named dean of the College of Arts and Sciences in July of 2005 and was named provost in July of 2009. As chief academic officer of the University, the provost is responsible for administration of all programs of instruction, research and service, and for facilitating the success of the university's faculty and students. The deans of seven colleges reported directly to him as well as the deputy provost, the senior vice provost for research, the vice president for student life and the vice provost for graduate and professional education Tom earned his doctorate in physical chemistry at the University of Delaware in 1982, after completing his bachelor's degree in biology at Pennsylvania State University in 1976. He was a post-doctoral research fellow at Iowa State University from 1981-83. Tom was an assistant professor of chemistry at the University of Nebraska. Previous to that position, he was an associate professor of chemistry at the university. He won the university's Parents Association Teaching Award in 1990 and 1991. In 2002-05, Tom became the vice provost for administration at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and was dean of graduate education and professor of chemistry. He joined the Rensselaer faculty in 1991 and chaired the Department of Chemistry from 1997-2001, and served as interim vice provost for institute diversity from 2002-03. In 1996, Tom won the Remsselaer Trustees' Outstanding Teacher Award. Tom's research in zeolite materials and polymeric materials has been funded by grants from the National Science Foundation, as well as support from the National Institutes of Health, and others, and he is the author or coauthor of numerous articles in professional journals. His wife, Anne, earned her master's degree in chemistry at the University of Delaware and her doctorate in veterinary medicine at Iowa State University.

In addition to Tom Apple, two neighbor island high school students who were Inducted into the 2013 HHSAA Hall of Honor will make an appearance at the HQC on Monday. They are **Keelan Ewaliko** from Baldwin, who is a 3-time MIL player of the year, despite missing part of his Senior year with an injury, was a "rocket" on the track winning the 100 and 200 State Championships and anchoring the winning 4 x 100 relay team. He will be a Rainbow Warrior this fall and play football and **Renny Richmond** who set a state record in the 100-meter fly as a Freshman, then broke the record as Sophomore and again as a Junior. She finished her career with 6 titles in all, including the 200 Freestyle and 50 Free. She will be attending Arizona in the fall. This Monday come and celebrate these great champions.
