**Jeaney Garcia - New Athletic Director - Punahou** - This is the first visit for Jeaney at the Honolulu Quarterback Club since assuming her position as Athletic Director. Jeaney has the honor of being the first female athletic director in the history of the school, overseeing 26 different sports, 120 teams, and over 300 coaches. Sports Illustrated has ranked Punahou's athletics program number one in the nation of or two consecutive years, 2008 and 2009. Punahou School is the largest independent school in the United States, with an enrollment of approximately 3,800 students, embracing high standards of character and achievement. Jeaney has been a coach, teacher, official, and administrator at the collegiate, high school, middle and elementary school, and recreational level for the past 25 years. She was previously at Brentwood School, in Los Angeles, CA for the past 10 years, where she was Athletic Director and Physical Education Department Chairperson. Come Monday and hear Jeaney speak at the HQC luncheon. Jeaney will be available for questions.

**Michael Tymn - Veteran Runner - Author of "Running on Third Wind" and "The Articulate Dead"** - Mike, a graduate of San Jose State School of Journalism, is a long-time freelance journalist who has been writing about track, cross-country and road-racing for more than 50 years. He wrote articles for the Honolulu Advertiser, covering running, swimming, biking, and triathlons. He is a former contributor editor of Runner's World magazine and has been a senior writer for Running Times magazine. He has also written a monthly column for National Masters News for the past 30 years, the longest-running column ever in the running sports. Mike was also one of Hawai'i's top runners in the 70's and early 80's. He won many races and also won four national masters championships. He won the 1979 Maui Marathon a few weeks short of his 43rd birthday and is still the oldest winner of that race. He is the only Hawai'i resident to have finished any marathon under 2 1/2-hours. Mike will speak on "Memorable People and Experiences from 60 Years of Running and Writing". Mike will entertain questions from the audience.

**Joan Davis - Race Director - Aloha State Games 10K - Secretary of the Honolulu Quarterback Club** - The Aloha State Games are an Olympic-style multi-sports festival for Hawai'i's athletes of all ages and abilities – often referred to as the “Olympics for the common person.” The purpose of the Games is to encourage healthy physical activity among Hawai'i residents by providing a positive avenue for personal development through competitive sports and

physical activity. The Games recognize the physical and mental accomplishments of Island residents, and encourage development of a statewide network of volunteers who work to advance amateur sports activities in Hawai'i. The Aloha State Games is an agenda of more than 20 different sports being contested during June and July in the 2010 Aloha State Games —This tournament is taking place during the month of June. Race Director, Joan will have the results of the 10K competition held Sunday.

In addition to our speakers, the HQC will be presenting the **Sports Persons of the Month May Awards**, selected by the Honolulu Quarterback Club to **Ashley Satterwhite, Punahou**, who during the month of May, was the female winner in the HHSAA State Track & Field Championships in 100 Meter Dash which qualified her to own the mythical title, "fastest female Hawai'i high school athlete for the year" and **Taylor Crabb, Punahou**, who was inducted into the HHSAA Hall of Honor for his athletic achievement in Volleyball and Basketball plus his academic achievement and his role in school activities and involvement in service to the community outside sports.
