In 2010 Coach Daniel also served as an assistant coach in 2010 for Stanford’s Cardinal’s national championship men’s team which had several local Hawaiian players. His strong ties to the Hawaiian Islands are sure to remain. He stayed home following a standout prep career on the Big Island and enjoyed four successful years as a key player for the University of Hawai’i’s volleyball team. As a freshman, Coach Daniel came off the bench and led the Warriors to a four-set victory in the 2002 NCAA Tournament semifinals against Penn State. In that series he had 21 assists. Hawai’i went on to win the national championship, he closed out his career as a team captain in 2005. The HQC welcomes back Coach Daniel.
