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The Honolulu Quarterback Club, celebrating 68 years, is pleased to announce the following Guest Speakers for their luncheon, Monday, July 14th, at the MGR:

- + **Harvey McInerny – Head Coach Track & Field – Kamehameha**
- + **Dylan Kane – Top Sprinter – Track & Field – Kamehameha**
- + **Vince Sokugawa – Head Sensei – State Judo Association**
- + **Chris Sokugawa – Sensei – State Judo Association**

Harvey McInerny – Head Coach – Track & Field – Kamehameha – Coach Harvey has been coaching track and field at Kamehameha for the past 16 years. For the last 5 years, Coach Harvey has been the boy's head coach. This year he became head coach for both teams. Track and Field is the largest sport's program at Kamehameha with over 300 athletes and 25 coaches. This will be the last year for Coach Harvey at Kamehameha. He is a Trustee for the Charles Lunalilo Trust and currently running for the position of Trustee-At-Large in the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. Coach Harvey will review the season and the state champions on Monday.

Dylan Kane – Top Sprinter – Track & Field – Kamehameha – Dylan won the 100m and 200m at the state championships this year. He was the anchor runner in the 4x100 and the 4x400 relays where the team ended in 4th place. In 2013, he ended in 4th place in the 200m & 7th place in the state's 100m dash. This year he was named an ILH All-Star football defensive back, 1st Team. Dylan was recently graded the #2 overall player at a Nike football camp where 1,300 players competed.

Vince Sokugawa – Head Sensei – State Judo Association – Vince has been involved in Judo for the past 52 years. He has been Head Sensei at the Pearl City Hongwanji for the past 6 years and served as Head Sensei for 25 years at the Waipahu Hongwanji. Vince started Judo at the age of 7 and is a 5th degree black belt and received his 1st Degree black belt at age 15. Vince is a 3-time unofficial Hawaii High School Champion and a 9-time Hompa Hongwanji Team Champion. He coached 2 students who were members of the USA team at the Junior World Championships and coached 2 students who also represented the USA at the Junior Pan American Games. At the games, both students won gold. Vince has been selected twice to represent the 50th State Judo Association for selecting team members and coaching them. Both teams, girls and boys ended up with gold medals in 2010 and 2014. Vince will take questions

Chris Sokugawa – Sensei – State Judo Association – Chris is a member of the 50th State Judo Association and is a member of the Pearl City Hongwanji. He has 26 years of Judo training and experience and started at the age of 4. Chris is a 3 degree black belt and received his 1st degree belt at age 15, just like his dad, Vince

Sokugawa. Chris is a 2-time ILH Champion and 2-time Champion at Saint Louis. He also coached 2 students who were members of the USA team at the Junior World Championships and coached 2 students who also represented the USA at the Junior Pan American Games. At the Pan American Games, both students won Gold medals. He lettered in football and wrestling while attending Saint Louis and was a member of the football team who won the state championship in 1999 and was a team member of the wrestling team that won state championships in 2001 and 2002. He attended the University of Utah and received his Bachelor's Degree in Sports Science. While attending the university, he played football and his team won the Mountain West Conference in 2003 and 2004 and the Fiesta Bowl. Chris will discuss his sports career.
