Gib Arnold - Head Coach - Men's Basketball - University of Hawai'i - In March of this year, the University of Hawaii hired Gib Arnold as the new Head Coach of the Men's Basketball Program. Coach Gib was previously at USC as an Assistant Coach for the past five years. He was instrumental in making USC achieve a record of three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, three straight twenty win seasons and the winningest four-year stretch in USC's history. This past season, Coach Gib assisted in helping USC capture the inaugural Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic hosted by the University of Hawaii. He is a graduate of Punahou School where he was a prep All-American and Hawaii high school Gatorade Player of the Year. Coach Gib went on to play for Arizona State, then played for Dixie State College in Utah. He completed his college career at San Diego, where he contributed his talent to helping the Tritons to a school-record of seventeen consecutive wins and a number 3 national ranking in the NCAA Division III. On Monday, Coach Gib will talk about his newly recruited team members and the hiring of his new coaches at the HQC Luncheon.

Spencer McLachlin - Outside Hitter - Men's Volleyball Team - Stanford University - Spencer returns to the HQC after two years of playing for Stanford University. We all know him from his high school playing days at Punahou. As a Sophomore, Spencer was a outstanding all-around player who possesses outstanding ball-control, blocking, digging and passing skills, as well as hitting. He was named All-MPSF third team and started in all thirty-one matches, ranked third on team kills, including twenty-kills against UCLA, UCSB, and BYU. He scored the second most service aces on the team had two hundred digs for the season, including a five dig effort against USC in the MPSF tournament. He also had twenty-two kills in a five-set winning effort at UCSB where he earned MPSF Academic All-Conference honors. As everyone knows, Stanford, this year, beat Penn State to win NCAA Championship. Much of the help this year came from his dad, Chris McLachlin, who is a first year assistant coach at Stanford specializing in team building and the mental training aspects of the game.

Jonathan Lyau - Recipient of 2009 Senior Male Athlete of the Year - was voted as the Senior Male Athletic of the Year by the members of the of the Honolulu Quarterback Club for 2009. He was the first Hawai'i resident to finish the Honolulu Marathon for the past three years and has recently been inducted into the Honolulu Marathon Hall of Fame. Jonathan has finished the race in first place sixteen times. He will receive his award on Monday.

John Campbell - Campbell Pacific/Royal Hawaii Rugby Union - John, a former president and

life-time member of the HQC is back from his home in San Diego to promote an upcoming Rugby Championship that will be played on Oahu in November this year at the Honolulu Kapiolani Park.
