+ Bobby Curran - Radio Host - ESPN 1420 Radio – Radio Voice “Warriors”
+ John Veneri – Marketing Director – KHON2 – Radio Color Voice “Warriors”

Bobby Curran - Radio Host - The Bobby Curran Show - ESPN 1420 Radio - Bobby returns to the Honolulu Quarterback Club to discuss the challenges he sees with the University of Hawai'i Football Warriors from a fan's point of view. Fall Camp is fully underway and Bobby has some strong opinions of the team, the coaches, the upcoming football schedule. He predicts the "Football Warriors" will end the 2011 season 11-2 and play in the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl in December. The games lost will be Washington at Husky Stadium due to turn-overs and LaTech in Ruston which has an excellent running back. Bobby is the voice for the University of Hawai'i football and men's basketball beside hosting his radio show and the "Call the Coaches Show" on ESPN 1420 Radio. He has been in Hawai'i Sports for over 20 years and has been named "Hawaii Sportscaster of the Year" by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association for several years. Bobby will entertain questions.

John Veneri - Marketing Director – KHON2 – ESPN 1420 Radio Color Voice “Warriors” - John who has been active with UH, as a sideline reporter for Warrior football on ESPN 1420 moves upstairs to rejoin his high school partner Bobby Curran as they call the games for the Warriors at home and on the road in 2011. He graduated in 1995 before starting his career as a fulltime broadcaster that year, John was involved in broadcasting ILH football games sitting alongside Bobby Curran. From there, he was hired as a sports reporter and anchor for KHON2 where he was best known for his sports challenges, "GO JOHNNY GO". John has been with KHON2 for his entire 16 year broadcast career and most recently stepped behind the camera to take over as the stations marketing director. He is a graduate of Kamehameha Schools Kapalama where he lettered in track and football for the Warriors. The all state sprinter was the anchor for the 1990 state 4 by 100 meter relay champions and was 4th in the state that year in the 100 meter dash. Recruited to walk-on by the University of Hawai'i Rainbow Warriors in 1990, John went on to earn the Alex Waterhouse scholarship for most deserving walk-on in 1991. John played slot-back in

the spread offense under Paul Johnson and was a big part of the Holiday Bowl championship in 1992. John will take questions from luncheon attendees.
